He appealed to the court to change its decision. Here, 'appealed to the court' will replace 'appealed for the court'. The verb 'appeal' is always followed by 'to'.

To change into passive voice, we change the active sentence's subject into the passive sentence's direct object and add the auxiliary verbs. Active form: is + first form of the verb + ing. Passive form: is + being + past participle form of the verb. So 'is making' will change to 'are being made'. The correct sentence is: All the reservations and arrangements are being made by the wedding planner in advance.

The sentences 'since prehistoric times, animals have been highly useful to us in providing food, clothing and source of income' and 'in medicine, development of new drugs and treatments are largely dependent on wildlife and wildlife habitat' confirm that wildlife has helped humans in all aspects like clothing, Development of new medicines, providing food, except education.

177. Option (1) is correct.

The sentence 'studies indicate that woodpeckers are capable of destroying 90% of codling moth larvae residing under the bark of trees' imply that Woodpeckers are capable of destroying 90% of codling moth larvae residing under the bark of trees.

178. Option (4) is correct.

It is explicitly mentioned that 'Biodiversity is the different variety of living beings within an ecosystem or in our planet'.

179. Option (4) is correct.

It is apparent from the statement 'apart from a bird feeder in the backyard, we can also take up other active pastimes, such as hiking, hunting, canoeing or wildlife photographing to relieve our parched nerves' that it is writing that cannot be taken up as a pastime related to wildlife.

180. Option (1) is correct.

The claim that wildlife habitat plays no role in preserving genetic diversity is completely contradictory; the opposite of 'Since prehistoric times, animals have been not been useful to us' is proved in the passage. The fact that biodiversity is a measurement of the health of ecosystems, proves the last option incorrect. The assertion 'most medicinal remedies contain at least one ingredient derived from a wild plant or animal' proves option (1) correct.

181. Option (2) is correct.

On the occasions when Aunt is calling Aunt like mastodons bellowing primeval swamps 'Bellowing' means emitting a deep loud roar, typically in pain or anger. 'Bellowing' is followed by 'across'.

182. Option (1) is correct.

Uncle James's letter about Cousin Mabel's peculiar behaviour is being shot round the family circle. 'Shot at' means ; to make an attempt at.' While 'shot round' means to encircle/revolve.

183. Option (1) is correct.

The clan has a tendency to ignore me. The verb 'tendency' is followed by 'to'.

184. Option (3) is correct.

It's one of the advantages I get from being a bachelor. 'Being a bachelor' is the right expression, not 'not being/removing/becoming a bachelor'.

185. Option (4) is correct.

According to my nearest and dearest, practically a half-witted bachelor at that. Here, 'bachelor at' is used for 'referring to a specific age'.

186. Option (2) is correct.

He hadn't eaten since last night. The word 'since' is used to refer to a time (an action that began in the past and is still continuing).

187. Option (3) is correct.

He used all his money for a ticket, boarded the train, as he had done many times. The word 'boarded' means to get onto or allow people to get onto a boat, train, or aircraft.

188. Option (4) is correct.

He coolly chatted with the conductor, to whom Dill was a familiar sight. Who should be used to refer to the subject of a sentence.

Whom should be used to refer to the object of a verb or preposition. The object of preposition is the conductor, hence, 'whom' is the correct usage.

189. Option (4) is correct.

If you've lost your money the conductor will lend you enough for dinner. 'Lend' means to give something to someone to be used for a period of time and then returned. In the given context, the probability of a person losing his money is discussed, and on that occasion, the conductor will grant some money. This act is lending.

190. Option (1) is correct.

Your father will pay him back at the end of the line. When the son borrows money from the conductor, in case he loses it, the father will pay it back.

191. Option (2) is correct.

The grammar concepts are graded systematically and explained with examples. The passage needs to be in the present tense, as this is about a book review, as exemplified in 'the listening and speaking sections have activities...' Moreover the auxiliary verb 'are' agrees with the past participle.

192. Option (1) is correct.

The grammar concepts are graded systematically and explained with examples followed by exercises. The sentence needs to be understood in a sequence- first the grammar concepts are graded systematically, then explained with examples, later followed by exercises.

193. Option (2) is correct.

The writing section provides abundant practice in functional and imaginative writing. The blank again requires a verb in the simple present tense.

194. Option (1) is correct.

The writing section provides abundant practice in functional and imaginative writing with necessary scaffolding to help learners. 'Assist' would have made sense, but not the past form of the verb. While 'formulate', 'discourage' do not make sense. So 'help' is the appropriate verb.

195. Option (3) is correct.

The listening and speaking sections have activities embedded in meaningful contexts that will encourage learners to interact confidently in English. It is stated that the practice of functional and imaginative writing with necessary scaffolding to enable learners. So, it is easy to conclude that the listening and speaking sections will encourage learners to interact confidently.

196. Option (2) is correct.

To my utter astonishment, the little dark boy was striding.

197. Option (1) is correct.

The little dark boy was striding imperiously (arrogantly) up and down the lawn. This act of superiority and arrogance astonished the speaker. Other options do not justify the context.

198. Option (1) is correct.

The white youngster walked abjectly (wretchedly) behind him. Blank 2 and blank 3 need negative words to justify the speaker's astonishment upon seeing the boys.

199. Option (1) is correct.

The little boy ran into the house. The act of moving from one place to another implies the preposition 'into'.

200. Option (3) is correct.

The little boy ran into the house and reappeared shortly. The adverb 'shortly' suggests that the boy returned quickly after running inside the house.
